Polyphony (Russian: «*разноголосность*») is a concept taken up by literary theory, speech act theory and linguistics to refer to the simultaneity of points of view and voices within a particular narrative plane. The concept was introduced by Mikhail Bakhtin, using a metaphor based on the musical term polyphony.. Bakhtin's primary example of polyphony was Fyodor Dostoevsky's prose.
